Earl Pinto joined Federal Occupational Health Service (FOH) as the Director for Administration and Resource Management (ARM) on September 26, 2010. As ARM Director, Mr. Pinto is responsible for oversight of a variety of functions, including budgeting, finance, contracting, human resources, information technology, and administrative activities.

Prior to joining FOH, Mr. Pinto worked in other agencies of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. Most recently, Earl Pinto served as Chief of Staff to the Director of the Program Support Center (PSC). In this role, he directed communications, workforce planning, and the staff of the Office of the Director. Previous to this position, he served as Communications Director for the PSC in charge of all internal and external communication activities. Prior to that, he served as the Special Assistant to the Commissioner of the Administration for Children, Youth, and Families in the Administration for Children and Families, where his duties included administrative and programmatic management.

Prior to joining HHS, Mr. Pinto worked as a corporate attorney for Bryan Cave LLP, a multi-national law firm. Mr. Pinto also worked for the Assistant Chief of Staff to Los Angeles' Mayor Richard Riordan. There, he drafted Mayoral communication products including speeches, correspondences, and policy briefing books. He also wrote the Mayor's testimony to the Federal Emergency Management Agency for the 1994 Northridge earthquake.

Mr. Pinto received a Bachelor's of Science from Cornell University. He also received a Master's of Public Administration from the University of Southern California, where he was a Dean's Merit Scholar and served as the graduate school's Student Council President. Finally, he received a law degree from the College of William & Mary Law School, where he served as the Managing Editor of the William & Mary Bill of Rights Journal. He has been admitted to the Washington, DC and State of Pennsylvania Bar.
